Turtleman's "trading camp" is representative of a time long ago during the Deerskin trade where both local Muskogee and Settlers would supply the market to meet the demand for buckskins. When Turtleman is not in his historical garb, he can oftentimes be found in the pineywoods and sloughs of the great Okefenokee Swamp or conducting one of his many Environmental Education programs.
